SUBJECT: Non-Fraternization

1. In accordance with COML/P(45)37 and with COML/M(45)6 Conclusion 65, I attach for your information a copy of an Order on the subject of non-fraternization which has been issued by the Commander-in-Chief of the British Zone to all British troops in Germany, including those in the British Sector of Berlin.

2. In addition, the following Order has been issued to the British troops in the British Sector of Berlin:-

"2. Owing to the congestion for amenities in BERLIN, NO GERMANS may be invited into clubs, canteens or other places of entertainment whatsoever, which have been requisitioned."

1. The following order has been issued by the C-in-C:

"1. The Allied Control Council has decided that the time has come to abolish all separate zonal orders on the subject of non-fraternization with the GERMAN people and to adopt a universal policy which will ensure uniform treatment of GERMANY.

2. All present orders about non-fraternization are now cancelled.

3. The following orders will remain in force :-

(a) No members of the armed forces will be billeted with GERMAN families.

(b) No member of the armed forces will be permitted to marry GERMANS.

4. I rely on all members of the armed forces to conduct themselves with dignity and to use their common sense when dealing with the Germans, twice our enemies in war during the last 30 years."
