REGULATIONS REGARDING RELATIONS BETWEEN  
ALLIED OCCUPYING FORCES AND THE INHABITANTS  
OF GERMANY.

-----

1. No member of the Armed Forces or civilian personnel of CCG (BE) may be billeted on, or live with, a German family.
2. No member of the armed forces or civilian personnel of CCG (BE) may spend the night in German houses, hotels or hostels etc.
3. All members of the armed forces and civilian personnel of CCG (BE) may visit German families in their homes providing that they return to their quarters by such appropriate times as may be laid down in current orders or instructions.
4. All members of the armed forces and civilian personnel of CCG (BE) may visit cafes, public houses etc. providing they are not out of bounds.
5. German men and women may not be entertained in messes or clubs, with the exception that Control Commission Officers' Messes may hold social semi-official functions for Germans with whom they work closely for the purpose as laid down by the Deputy Military Governor. This does not apply to Army Officers' Messes.
6. German men and women may not be invited into requisitioned premises except on duty.
7. German men and women may be invited into Cinema shows run by AKC as laid down in BAOR GRO 2972 of 1946, and to CSEU as laid down in BAOR GRO 3049 of 1946.
8. German employees may not be tipped. BAFSV will not be given to Germans, nor to any unauthorised person. CCG RO 692 of 1946 refers.
9. Members of the armed forces and civilian personnel of CCG (BE) visiting leave centres and clubs are forbidden to have social relations with the German employees.
10. Dances may be held to which Germans are invited. Such dances will not be held in requisitioned premises unless no other hall is available. If Allied women are invited to such dances, they will invariably be warned that Germans will also be present. Military officers will not dance with German women at OR dances. Only military officers on duty will attend OR dances to which Germans are invited.
11. No member of the Allied forces may marry a German except as laid down in BAOR/3752/1/A(PS1) of 10 Sep 46. Conditions with which CCG civilian personnel will have to comply when they desire to remain in CCG after marrying German nationals will, it is expected, be announced shortly.
12. Games and sports may be played against German teams but not against Dienstgruppen or other similar organisations.
13. All members of armed forces and civilian personnel of CCG (BE) are encouraged to assist local girls' and boys' clubs.

14. All members of the armed forces and civilian personnel of CCG (BE) may visit Museums. They may visit German cinemas in the British Zone of BERLIN, but may not visit German cinemas elsewhere in GERMANY. They may visit theatres and opera houses providing that seats are on sale through army or CCG (BE) channels.

15. It is forbidden to permit the carriage of Germans in WD or CCG (BE) transport except as laid down in CCG RO 555 of 1946.

16. Units, Messes and Individual members of the armed forces and civilian personnel of CCG (BE) may only make local purchases in GERMANY as laid down in CCG RO 701 of 1946.

17. It is forbidden for any member of the armed forces or civilian personnel of CCG (BE) to dispose of any goods including cigarettes and tobacco, to civilians either by sale, exchange, or for services rendered whether the goods have been issued by the War Department, purchased from NAAFI/BEFI or other canteens provided for soldiers and civilians of BAOR and CCG (BE) or sent to this theatre from UK or elsewhere for the benefit of allied troops or civilians.
